

Alternative Credit Options

CSU Global accepts a variety of alternative credits that enable students to earn their degree quickly and at a reduced cost. Alternative credit options allow you to demonstrate competency, knowledge, prior experience, and independent learning in a particular subject area for course credit. If you are an Undergraduate student, alternative transfer credits can be used in addition to other forms of transfer credit to fulfill degree requirements.

It is important to verify that the courses you want to transfer in are not duplicative of something you have already taken and that we are able to accept it so we recommend working with your Success Counselor to go over transfer credit limits and your alternative credit options. They can help you find the alternative credit partner that fits your needs best and keeps you progressing toward degree completion.

CLEP

Saylor Academy

Saylor Academy is a non-profit organization which offers free online courses to prepare for exams to use as transfer credit. All courses can be taken at no cost and students pay \$25 to take a proctored exam when ready. Sophia

Sophia is another option for taking online, self-paced, courses and completing an exam for ACE approved transfer credit. StraighterLine

StraighterLine focuses on general education course equivalencies that are a required part of any bachelor's degree. There is a monthly membership cost of \$99 and the typical exam fee is \$59 per course. Some benefits of StraighterLine are free one-on-one online tutoring which includes writing center, scheduled, or drop-in, free transcript processing and easy credit transfer, and live support – get the technical, membership, or course support you need from our dedicated Student Advisors. Study.com is a membership based alternative credit option. The monthly subscription is \$199 per month and students have the ability to take up to 2 proctored exams per month.
