Course Repeats and Financial Aid

If you are using financial aid to pay for school, and you do not pass a course, there are certain situations in which Financial Aid will pay for you to attempt the course again.

According to CSU Global policy, the following grades are considered non-passing:

Undergraduate:

- "D" or "F" in a Major or Specialization Course
- "F" in General Education or Elective Course

Graduate:

- "D" or "F" in a Major or Specialization Course
- Graduate students are only allowed to receive two (2) "C's" in their program so a third "C" would also be considered non-passing

Financial Aid will cover the retake of a non-passed course in the following situations:

- You may receive financial aid when repeating a course that was failed ("F") or in which a withdrawal occurred (W), regardless of the number of times the course was failed (the [SAP](#) policy still applies)
- You may receive financial aid when repeating a course in which you earned a grade of "D" or "C" **but financial aid will only cover one (1) additional attempt**

For Example:

1st Attempt	2nd Attempt	3rd Attempt	Eligible for FA?
F	D	Enrolled	Yes
D	C	Enrolled	No
D	F	Enrolled	No
W	F	Enrolled	Yes
D	W	Enrolled	No
F	F	Enrolled	Yes
